Mulcahy Scholarship Coordinator, Linda Croston, reflects on the 2022 Mulcahy Scholarship Program, where five wonderful recipients were selected to travel to Galway, Ireland for two weeks this summer to attend the Celtic Irish American Academy (CIAA).

"The selection process is always a stringent one, and this year was no different, as the applications received were extremely strong", noted Croston. The group selected consisted of Grace Moylan (Yonkers, NY), Kelly O'Neill (Queens, NY), Justyne Pereida (Leadville, CO), Ruairi Beirne (Yonkers, NY) and Seamus McEntee (Queens, NY).

The group travelled from the US to Dublin, Ireland in July, where they were met by representatives from the CIAA and transported to their generous host familes in Galway, where they lived for two weeks as part of the family.

By day, the group attended classes at the CIAA, learning some "gaelige", Irish history and some GAA hurling drills, and even sampling some Irish céilí dancing. They were also treated to numerous excursions organized by the CIAA, incuding a visit to the Burren, Cliffs of Moher, NUI Galway, Trinity College in Dublin, Kylemore Abbey and trekked Diamond Hill, in aid of the Galway Simon Community.

By night, they got to relax and enjoy the many sights that Galway has to offer. They had the chance to enjoy some Trad on the Promenade in Salthill, take 5 dips in the Atlantic ocean, with the more adventurous taking a leap from the top tower at Blackrock. The Mulcahy Scholarship recipients were also kindly treated to a dinner at the Creamery Café on the Promenade in Salthill

by AICC board members, Kathy and Seamus Galvin, whose brother, Ronan Galvin, owns the restaurant.

They also attended some inspirational leadership talks by global communications expert , Gina London and Fintan Maher, of the Galway Simon Community. Our very own, Justyne Pereida proudly presented to the group on the history of Leadville, Colorado. Leadville, the highest city in North America is famous for its mining that saw thousands of Irish men die here in poor conditions in the late 1800s/early 1900s. A memorial commemorating these Irish immigrants in Leadville is in the final stages of construction at Evergreen Cemetery. Once complete, the memorial will honor over 1,300 individuals who were buried in their historic cemetery over a century ago.

The Mulcahy Scholarship was launched in 2018 by the Aisling Irish Community Center in Yonkers, New York, in tribute to Denis Mulcahy and his family's commitment to Project Children, a charity that for forty years, worked untiringly to change the lives of children across Northern Ireland. Project Children provided the children of Northern Ireland a 6-week summer reprieve from the violence of "the Troubles" so forty years later, the Aisling Irish Center is replicating the reverse by providing American high school students the opportunity to experience firsthand Irish culture in a fun and diverse way.

And this year did not disappoint, and "we are very proud of our young leaders that seized this wonderful opportunity and explored their Irish heritage" celebrated Croston.
